

Camp Killoqua COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING Summer 2022

Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the Counselor-In-Training (CIT) program at Camp Killoqua! Participants gain training in how to use effective leadership skills throughout their lives, and how to work effectively with children at camp and other settings. We seek a variety of applicants - some who may be longtime campers, some who may be new to camping - but all who are highly motivated, ready to work and play hard, and who demonstrate additional responsibility in accepting the challenges of leadership.

The CIT program runs two to four weeks each summer, over two consecutive summers. Applicants apply and are selected for each year of the program. CIT training helps prepare participants for leadership roles in all walks of life, especially those involving leadership with children. Skills and experience gained during CIT can be used not only in future work with children, but in jobs and volunteer work throughout their lives. Plus, it helps them to be better aunts, uncles and parents if they, some day, have children of their own.

Each summer, Killoqua strives to bring together staff members who share a wide variety of experiences and backgrounds with our campers. Even if you complete the program successfully, it does not guarantee you a staff position at this camp in the future. To avoid disappointment, we ask those who apply to CIT to understand that they should participate because they have a strong interest in learning great leadership and kid skills, and not because they are seeking a specific position here in the future. Skills learned at camp are useful in an amazing variety of other life situations!

CIT PROGRAM INFORMATION

Summer 2022

Dates & Fees

CIT 2 runs Sessions 1-4, July 5- July 29.

CITs go home for breaks between sessions each Friday evening to Sunday morning. Please note session 2 is a mini session that starts Tuesday afternoon, CIT 2 is \$1290 for 4 weeks for early registration, and \$1340 after April 15th. CITs will also purchase a CIT shirt which will cost between \$10-\$20.

CIT 1 runs Session 5– 6, July 31– August 5.
CIT go home for breaks between sessions each
Friday evenings to Sunday morning. CIT1 is \$960 for
three weeks for early registration, and \$1010 after
April 15th. CITs will also purchase a CIT shirt which
will cost between \$10-\$20.

Program Content

If selected, you'll take on expanded responsibilities and share your talents with the camp community. Camp is about learning by doing, CIT develop their skills through a variety of fun and challenging activities, workshops and discussions. You will work directly with campers, while staff members mentor you, and you get to practice leading groups and teaching games and activities. Participants get frequent feedback and evaluations, do self-evaluations, and keep a leadership journal to help them gain the most from their experiences. CIT is a coed unit at camp, with separate sleeping quarters for each gender.

Year 1 is a great introduction to how a summer camp operates, combined with opportunities to define your own leadership style. Go behind the scenes, learning the philosophy and objectives of Camp Fire and organized camping. Talk to and shadow staff. Participate in interactive workshops on everything from leadership and goal-setting to child characteristics and behavior. Sharpen your skills in areas like communication, leading and teaching methods, initiative games, songs, crafts, field games, environmental awareness, waterfront activities and first aid/safety. Try out your new skills when you assist counselors or the riding staff.

Year 2 has even more hands-on opportunities. Get ready with kick-off workshops, then head out for two sessions as a co-counselor or riding staff assistant in your live-ins. Work closely with staff mentors, who will coach you and give you opportunities to lead campers. You'll also have time with other CIT to debrief and share your experiences, and to participate in advanced workshops. Your group also gets to plan and lead some all-camp activities. Learn more about job opportunities at camps and other jobs, and learn skills for applying and interviewing. CIT graduates may be invited back later in the summer to assist with camp programs.

Requirements for Applicants

- Completion of your sophomore year of high school by June.
- Interested in learning leadership skills, enjoys working in a cooperative environment, and enjoys working with children.
- · Available to attend all weeks of the program.

Application Process

1. Complete and return the online application .

Applications must be received by February 25, 2022.

- Send the online reference form to three references, and encourage them to return them promptly. Your application is complete only when both the application and three reference forms are in.
- When your complete application is received, we will contact you to let you know whether we will interview you.
- 4. You will be contacted to schedule an interview after the application deadline.

Interviews are usually 20 minutes long. (If you are unavailable that day, we will arrange a different time.) CIT is a selective program; an interview for or acceptance into it is not guaranteed. However, all interested and eligible applicants are encouraged to apply. We are looking for people who have great potential to grow as leaders! Killoqua also offers adventure trips and other resident camp opportunities for teens.

Applicants will be notified by March 31st of whether of not they have been accepted into the program, pending completed reference checks.

A Note to Parents/Guardians

Thank you for supporting your teen's interest in this Leadership program! As your camper starts the application process, you can help by letting him/her do all the work Sometimes it is easier or quicker if the parent contacts us with questions or hands out forms to references, however, we like the applicants to do all of these things themselves. This helps teens get more comfortable making calls and building the other skills that go with researching and interviewing for a job or volunteer opportunity.
